This is George.

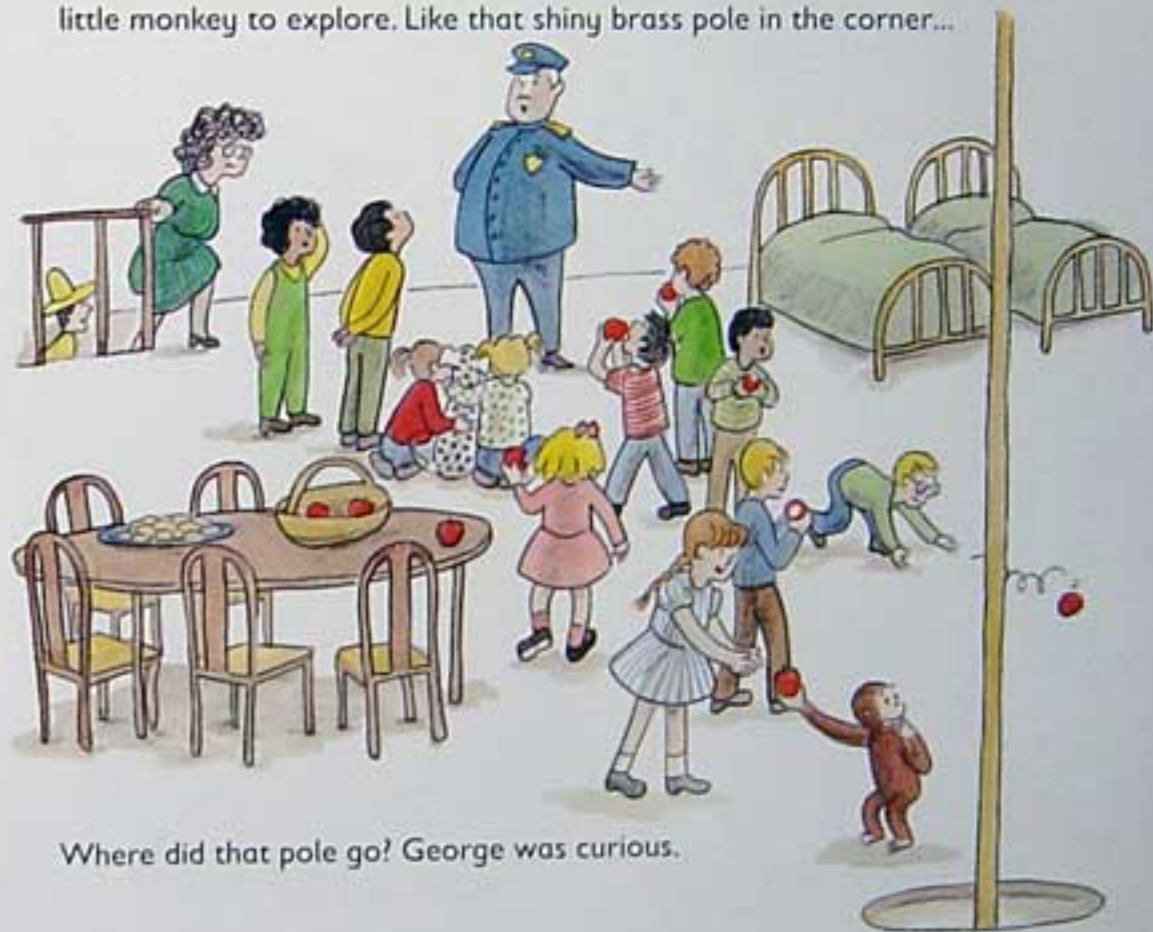
He was a good little monkey and always very curious.
