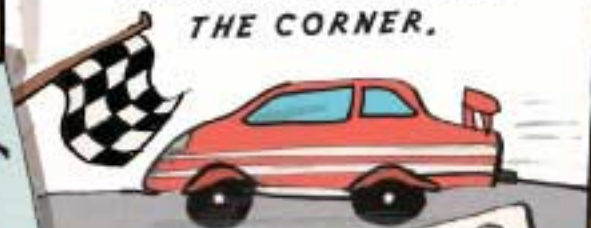

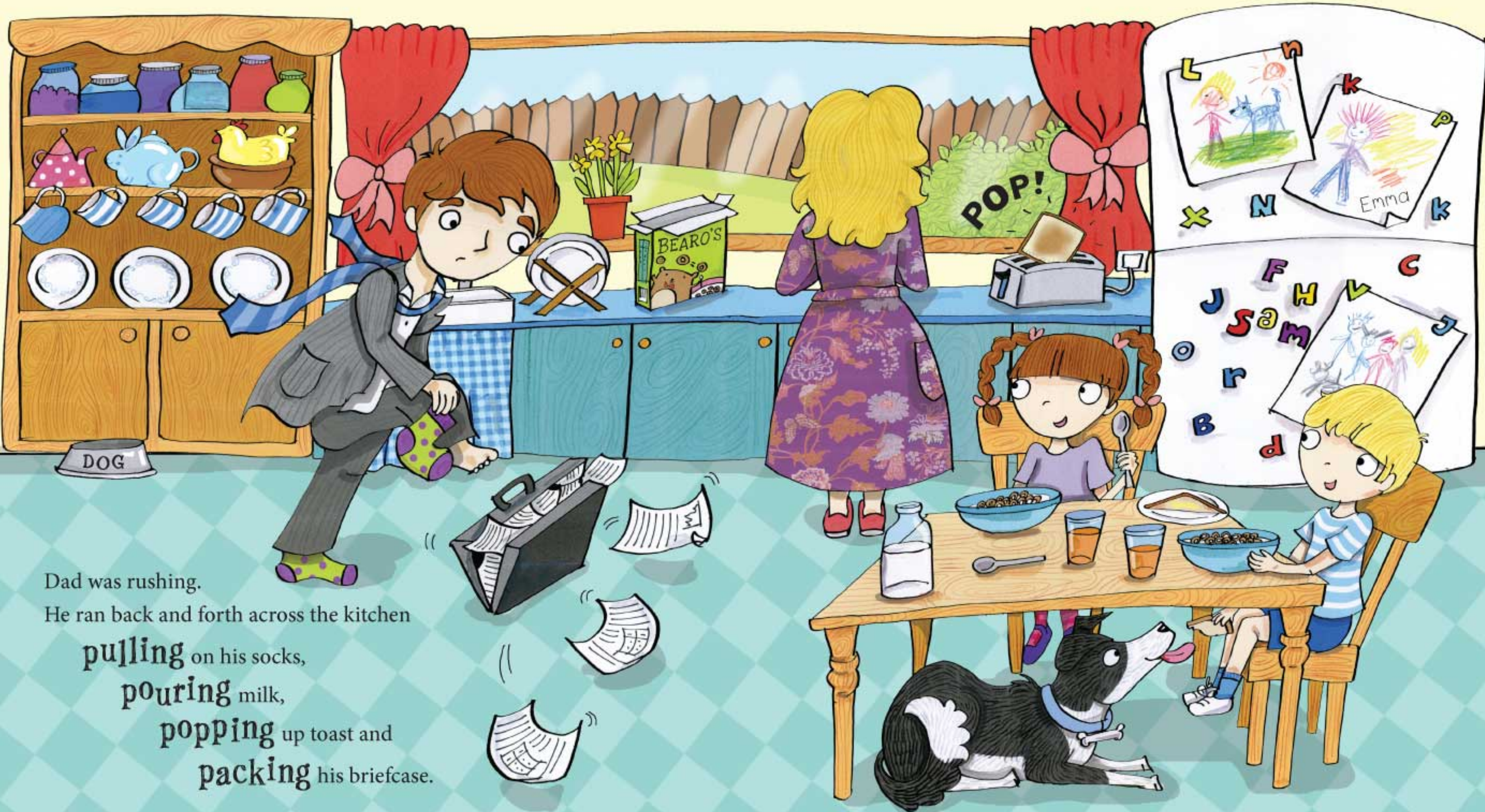

**packing** his briefcase.

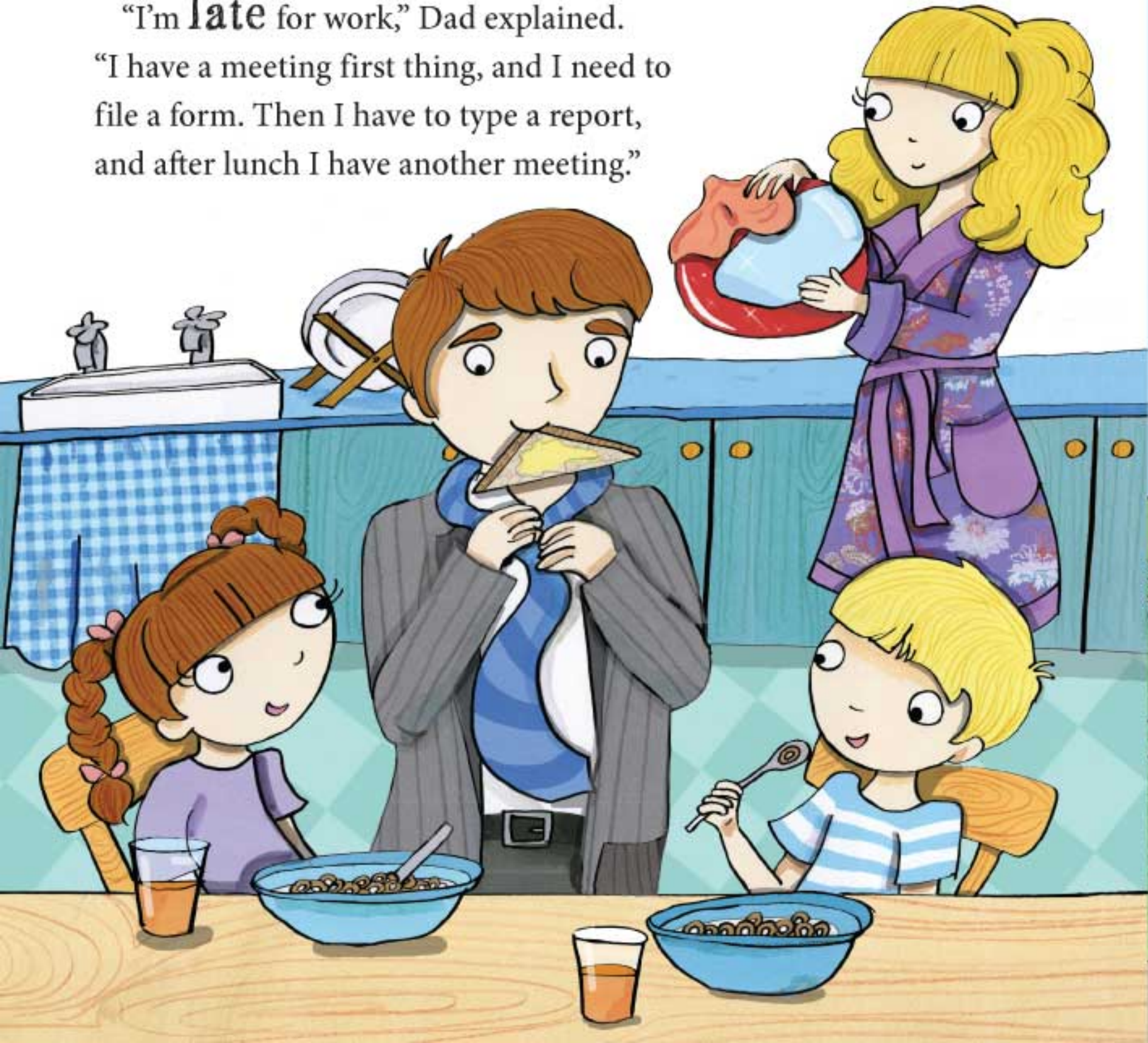


“You’re busy this morning,” said Emma.

They had just had a **brilliant** idea.

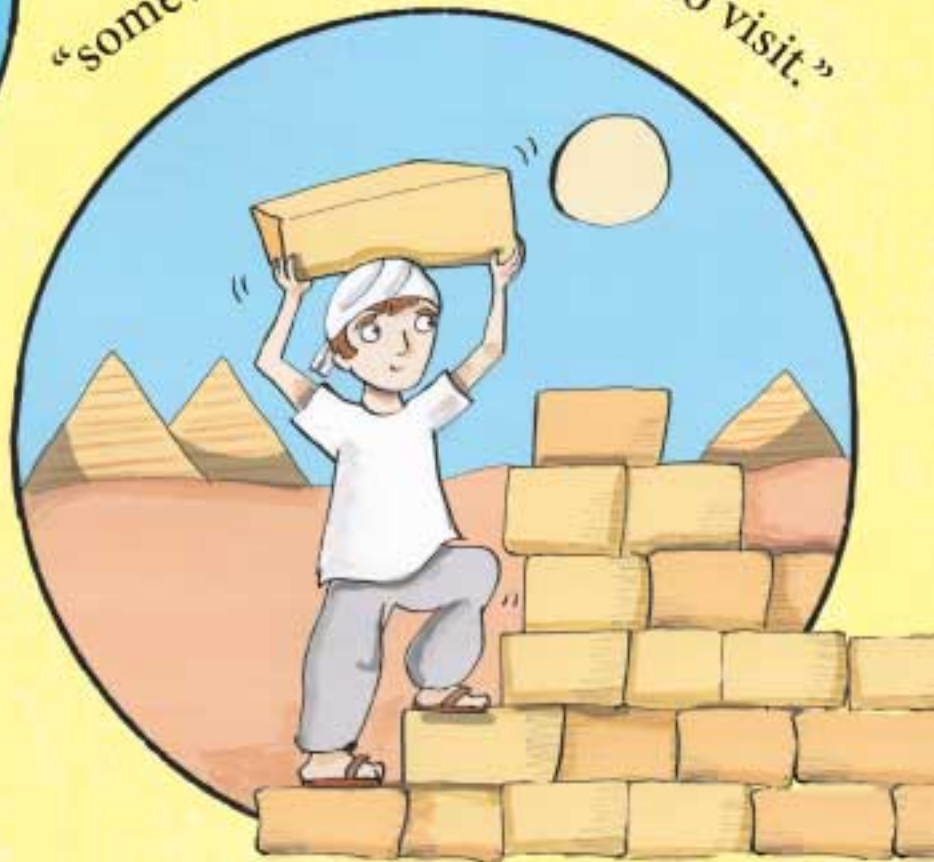


"Let's find Dad a more exciting job," said Emma.
